- Founded in 1988.
- We have 100 members:
 - Physicians, nurses, clinical scientists, project managers and various types of support staff
 - who work for organisations, such as pharmaceutical companies and contract research organisations, involved in the early development of new medicines
- We have links with other organisations involved in developing new medicines, such as ABPI, Institute of Clinical Research and Contract Clinical Research Association.
- Also, we share some of our symposia with the Clinical Section of the British Pharmacological Society, an organisation whose members are mostly from university departments of clinical pharmacology.

Purpose

- The AHPPI is run by a committee and provides information to members via its website
- The AHPPI leadership team is elected by members every 3 years, and the next elections will be held at the beginning of 2015.
